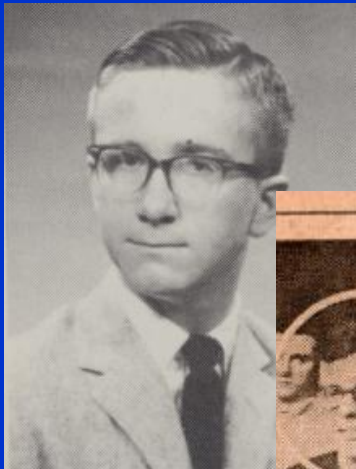


Shorridge Gets Set

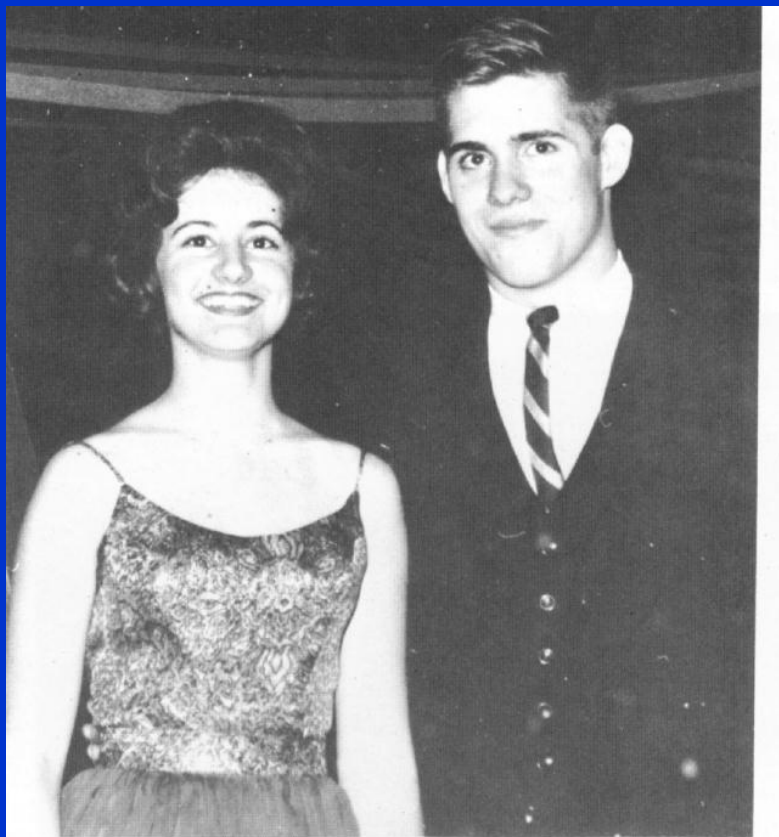
